Major league baseball returned to K. C. in '69 with the Royals taking the field at Municipal Stadium, the one time home of the Oakland A's before that team's move to the West Coast for the '68 season. They opened the year 2-0 against the Twins at home. Moe Drabowsky won the Royals' very first game. The ball club was managed by Joe Gordon, the former standout second baseman (and former AL MVP) for the Yankees and Indians...Ed Kirkpatrick was the team leader that first year with 14 home runs. Joe Foy topped the ball club with 71 RBI. Bob Oliver hit thirteen dingers; Mike Fiore added twelve. Young Lou Piniella cracked 11 homers, was second to Foy with 68 RBI and led the team in hits (139). The Royals hit 240 and 98 home runs...The pitching staff's top winner was former Oriole Wally Bunker with twelve. Lefty Bill Butler (nine wins) led the staff with 156 K's. Reliever Drabowsky and starter Dick Drago both won eleven games. Bunker and Drago completed ten contests apiece while Butler led the staff in shutouts with four. The Royals finished eighth in the A.L. with a sound 3.72 ERA...K. C. would end the year 28 games behind the first place Twins in the AL West.
