The ‘69 Sox HAVE to be one of the WORST teams in major league history. Their longest winning streak was five games; the longest losing skein was eight. Al Lopez managed the team to an 8-9 record before he was replaced by Don Gutteridge on May 2nd. Gutteridge guided the ball club to a 60-85 mark...Team leaders: Bill Melton (23 homers, 87 RBI) and Carlos May (18 home runs, 62 RBI). “Buddy” Bradford reached double figures with eleven dingers. Luis Aparicio led the Sox in hits (168) and runs scored (77). Chicago was sixth in the A.L. in batting (.247) and ninth in home runs (112)...Joe Horlen (13 wins) and Gary Peters (140 K’s) led the pitching staff. Peters won ten games along with closer Wilbur Wood. Tommy John won nine contests. White Sox hurlers compiled a 4.21 ERA, second to last in the league. As a team, they scored 625 runs and allowed 723...The franchise came close to moving to Milwaukee; they played 11 games there in ‘69.
