Joe Torre was the Cards' leader with 18 home runs and 101 runs driven in. Third baseman Mike Shannon followed with 12 homers while Lou Brock put up a "triple double" for the season: 33 doubles, 10 triples and 12 home runs. He led the ball club in hits (195) and runs scored (97). Brock was also THIRD in the majors in swiped base bags. Vada Pinson, who hit ten dingers, was second on the team with 70 RBI. The Redbirds hit .253, 90 home runs and led the N.L. with 228 doubles...The pitching staff was led by who else but Bob Gibson who ruled the pitching staff with a 20-13 record, 269 strikeouts, 28 complete games, and four shutouts. Lefty Steve Carlton was 17-10 with 210 K's and ten complete games. "Nellie" Briles won fifteen and Mike Torrez ten games. The Cards' staff was second in the majors with a 2.94 ERA and led the National League. They were second in the N.L. with 63 complete games and fewest home runs allowed (99)...The Cubs led the NL East for the majority of the summer while the Redbirds would make a late season surge, coming as close as 7 ½ games September 10th. The Cards ended the year 13 games behind the NL East champion Mets who won their season series, 12-6. Versus the arch-rival Cubs, St. Louis was 9-9.
