One need look no further than Carl Yastrzemski's batting average for a testimonial for "The Year of the Pitcher." "Yaz" led the American League with the still-current lowest average in league history to win a batting crown. He led the Bosox with 90 runs scored and 162 base hits, but finished second to Ken Harrelson with 23 homers and 74 RBI. As for "Hawk," he blasted 35 home runs and drove in one hundred nine. George Scott was awarded a Gold Glove for defensive excellence--along with Yastrzemski and Reggie Smith--but posted the lowest batting average and home run output of his career with at least 100 at bats. Smith was good for 15 dingers and 69 RBI. Boston hit .236 and 125 homers as a team...Ray Culp and Dick Ellsworth both won sixteen games to lead the pitching staff. Culp's 190 strikeouts were the most of the group. The staff ERA was 3.33...The defending A. L. champions hung around .500 almost all season. They would go a season-high twelve games above that mark in late September and end the year 17 games out of first place...Former Yankee great Elston Howard played his final two years in Boston. The twelve-time All Star was released after the season.
