Many former Brooklyn Dodger fans had to be delirious when old favorite, Gil Hodges, was hired away by the Mets from the expansion Washington Senators after the '67 season. Hodges had played briefly with the Mets when they were born and after hanging up his first baseman's glove, he moved to D. C. where he managed the Solons to a marked improvement in the mid-60s. The Mets' brass was looking for a mature, steadying influence for a team which now featured some young, talented players. Hodges would use the '68 campaign as a "live laboratory" to see what he REALLY had for a ball club. No one--not even Gil--was sure what the future held for the young men in the club house...Ed Charles led the Mets with 15 home runs. He drove in fifty-three. Ron Swoboda, who hit eleven homers, was the top RBI-man with fifty-nine. Cleon Jones clubbed 14 dingers while driving in 55 runs. Jones led the ball club in hits (151) and runs scored (63). The Mets finished the year last in the league with a .228 batting average and fifth with 81 home runs. They scored 473 times...Lefty Jerry Koosman was the pitching staff's top winner with 19 victories. He was also the leader with 17 complete games and seven shutouts. Tom Seaver (16-12) led the staff with 205 K's; Koosman followed with 178 strikeouts. Twenty-one year old Lynn Nolan Ryan was six up and nine down for the year. He racked up 133 strikeouts and 75 bases on balls. The staff's ERA was 2.72, fourth in the National League. They were second with 1,014 strikeouts.
