The Angels fared no better than most teams in the major leagues during "The Year of the Pitcher". The season ended for The Halos with a .227 team batting average and only 83 home runs. (The average batting average for a ball club in the majors was .237; the average for homers was 99.75.) The Angels had three players reach double-digit home run totals: Rick Reichardt (21), Don Mincher (13), and Roger Repoz (13). Jim Fregosi led the team with 150 base hits and 77 runs scored. He was named to the All Star squad for the fourth time. Fregosi's thirteen triples topped the A. L. George Brunet won thirteen games to lead the pitching staff and finished the season with 132 strikeouts, eight complete games, and five shutouts. Jim McGlothlin was a winner of ten ball games and led the staff in strikeouts (135). He also completed eight contests. The pitching corps' ERA was 3.43, ninth in the league...At the season's mid-point, the Angels were in seventh place, fifteen games out of first with a 38-43 record. They won one season series, beating the Senators, 12-6, while splitting with the Red Sox, 9-9.
