Willie McCovey led the Giants with 36 home runs, 105 RBI, and 153 base hits. "Big Mac" was tied for second in the major leagues in homers and third in runs batted in. He finished third in National League MVP voting. Jim Ray Hart (23 home runs, 78 RBI) and Willie Mays (23 homers, 79 RBI, 84 runs scored) made the Giants' power hitters a difficult group to get out. The ball club hit .239 but were second in the N.L. in home runs (108). Rookie Bobby Bonds was promoted during the season and knocked out nine home runs while driving in thirty-five in 81 games played...Juan Marichal had an incredible season in leading the pitching staff with a 26-9 record and 218 strikeouts. His 30 complete games led the major leagues. Gaylord Perry and his "grease ball" came in at 16-15 with 173 K's and 19 complete games. Ray Sadecki and Mike McCormick each won 12 contests. The former had 206 strikeouts and led the staff with six shutouts. In "The Year of the Pitcher," the staff ERA was 2.71--third best in the league. Giants' hurlers were tops in the N.L. with 77 complete games while allowing the fewest bases on balls (344)...The Giants ended the season nine games in back of the N.L. Champion Cardinals and won the season series, 10-8. They split the season series versus the Dodgers, 9-9.
