"The Toy Cannon," Jimmy Wynn, led this last place ball club with 26 home runs and 85 runs scored. He drove home 67 runs. "Rusty" Staub, one could say "the face of the franchise," topped the team in RBI (72) and base hits (172). He and three others followed Wynn with all hitting six homers! Houston finished a lowly eighth in the N. L. with a .231 team batting average; and not surprisingly, they were last in home runs (66). The Astrodome, "The Eighth Wonder of the World," highly favored pitchers. At least batters had the artificial playing surface in their favor...Astros chuckers posted the seventh best ERA in the league (3.26). During "The Year of the Pitcher," they led the league in strikeouts (1,021) and placed third in complete games (50). Hard-throwing Don Wilson's 13 wins highlighted the staff; he struck out 175 batters. Dave Giusti was the leader with 186 K's and 12 complete games. He collected eleven victories. Larry Dierker won twelve ballgames, struck one hundred sixty-one, and completed ten contests. Denny Lemaster won ten times...Houston took two season series: 11-7 over the Dodgers and 10-8 versus the Mets. The Astros ended the year 25 games in back of the pennant-winning Cardinals who dominated their season's match-ups, 13-5... Managers' records: Hatton 23-38; Walker 49-52...The '68 All Star Game the N. L. won, 1-0.
