In the 54th season of the Houston Colt .45s/Astros franchise, the ball club made the playoffs for the first time since 2005 following a long string of excruciatingly painful, woeful losing campaigns. The Astros beat the Yankees in the Wild Card game at Yankee Stadium, 3-0, but were knocked out of the post-season by the eventual World Champion K. C. Royals who would not be denied. Kansas City eliminated the 'Stro's in five games...DH Evan Gattis was able to stay healthy and produced the Astros' best numbers at the plate with 27 homers and 88 RBI. Luis Valbuena and Chris Carter hit 25 and 24 home runs, respectively. Jose Altuve had team highs in base hits (200), runs scored (86), and doubles (40)...Ace Dallas Keuchel, the winner of the Wild Card game, sparkled even brighter with twenty wins and 216 K's to lead the pitching staff. Collin McHugh won nineteen and struck out 171 batters...Houston hit .250 and finished second in the A.L. with 230 homers...The staff ERA led the league at 3.57. They gave up the fewest runs (618) and fewest home runs (148)...Keuchel led the A.L. in wins and was the recipient of the Cy Young Award.
