The Dodgers hit an eye-popping 187 home runs to lead the National League. Adrian Gonzalez was high-man with twenty-eight and right behind was Joc Pederson who blasted twenty-six. Gonzalez also led the ball club with 90 RBI, 157 base hits, and 76 runs scored. Yasmani Grandal and Justin Turner both hit 16 homers. The mercurial Yasiel Puig hit eleven homers in 79 games. Dodger batters hit .250 for the season...Clayton Kershaw and Zack Greinke combined to win 35 games: Kershaw (16) and Greinke (19). "Kid K" punched out 301 batters while Greinke struck out 200 for the season. Lefty Brett Anderson was a ten-game winner. Closer Kenley Jansen whiffed 80 batters. The Dodger staff had a 3.44 ERA and struck out 1,396 opponents to finish fifth and second in the league, respectively...The year for the Dodgers ended when the Mets beat them three games to two in the NLDS. L. A. hit only two home runs to the Mets seven.
