The Blue Jays of '15 clinched a playoff spot on September 25th for the first time since 1993 when they were World Champions. Five days later, they won the AL East and then went on to defeat Texas, 3-2, in the ALDS. The Kansas City Royals knocked off the Blue Jays after a hard-fought ALCS, 4-2. Emotions were very high at various times during the series from overly aggressive play on the field...Josh Donaldson was the A.L. MVP off his monster season of 41 homers and 123 RBI. He led the league in runs batted in and runs scored (122). His 184 base hits topped the ball club. The Jays led the majors with 232 homers and 891 runs scored. As a team, they hit .269...The pitching staff ended the year with a 3.80 ERA, fifth in the league. Mark Buehrle led the staff with 15 wins. Marco Estrada and Drew Hutchison both won thirteen games. Estrada led the hurlers with 131 K's. Knuckleballer R. A. Dickey was 11-11 and struck out 126 batters. Lefthanded reliever Brett Cecil whiffed seventy for the season... Toronto beat both of their closest pursuers in season series: 13-6 over the Yankees and 11-8 over Baltimore...Starting outfielder Michael Saunders played in only a handful of games due to a knee injury he suffered in Spring Training which never healed properly.
