The retirement of Derek Jeter—who had worn Yankee pinstripes for twenty years—and nagging injuries to Jacoby Ellsbury and Mark Teixeira (the latter's season was ended with a fracture in a leg) didn't keep "The Bronx Bombers" from earning home field advantage for the A.L. Wild Card game. Houston ended the Yanks' season, however, winning that game, 3-0, at "The Stadium." On June 19th, Alex Rodriguez popped a homer to rightfield off the Tigers' Justin Verlander for his 3,000th career hit... "A-Rod" led the Yankees with 33 home runs. He drove home eighty-six. Brian McCann hit 26 homers and topped the team with 94 RBI. Before Teixeira's season ended, he had blasted 31 round-trippers and driven in seventy-nine. Chase Headley posted a team high for base hits (150) while Brett Gardner was the Yanks' leader with 94 runs scored. For the year, New York hit .251 and 212 homers... Nathan Eovaldi, lost for the season in September with a painful elbow, was the pitching staff's top winner with fourteen victories. Michael Pineda, finally healthy and tagged with high expectations, led the staff with 156 K's. Pineda was a twelve-game winner along with Masahiro Tanaka. The latter rang up 139 strikeouts. Closer Andrew Miller had an even 100 strikeout victims. He finished 53 games for the campaign. The staff ERA was a respectable 4.03 and second in the A.L. with 1,370 strikeouts... They finished 11-8 in the season series with Boston. Division champion Toronto won thirteen of nineteen games versus the Yankees.
