The Astros ended the season 23 games behind NL West Champ, Cincinnati, and won only THREE of eighteen games from the Reds during the regular season...Jimmy Wynn led the ball club with 27 home runs. He scored 82 runs and drove in eighty-eight. Denis Menke was tops on the team with 92 RBI and 171 base hits. He hit 13 dingers. Doug Rader popped 25 taters and knocked in 87 runs. Joe Morgan hit only eight homers but led the Astros by scoring 102 times. Prior to his trade to the Cubs, Joe Pepitone cracked 14 home runs. Nineteen-year old Cesar Cedeño, blessed with five-tool talent, made his debut June 20th going two for five against the Braves. For the year, he would hit 21 doubles, seven home runs, 110 base hits, and drive in 45 runs. Houston hit .259 and 129 home runs...Number one starter Larry Dierker topped the pitching staff with 16 victories, 191 strikeouts, and 17 complete games. Jack Billingham won 13 games while Don Wilson was an 11-game winner. Denny Lemaster was 7-12 with 103 K's. The staff was eighth in the N.L. with a 4.23 ERA.
