The Solons finished dead last, 38 games behind AL East Champ Baltimore...Washington WON two season series: 8-4 vs. the White Sox and 7-5 vs. Milwaukee...The Senators DID win six of eighteen contests with the Orioles... "The Capital Punisher," Frank Howard, led the ball club with 44 homers, 126 RBI, and 90 runs scored. He also topped the American League in home runs. Mike Epstein popped 20 homers while Aurelio Rodriguez contributed nineteen to go with 76 runs batted in. Eddie Brinkman, fresh off his best year ever as a batter in '69, led the team with 164 hits. The ball club hit .238 and 138 home runs...Dick Bosman led the pitching staff with 16 victories, seven complete games, and four shutouts. Joe Coleman (eight wins) was the staff leader with 152 strikeouts. Bosman punched out 134 batters. Jim Hannan won nine contests. The staff ERA was 3.80, seventh in the A.L.
