The season after their most unexpected but much celebrated World Championship, the Mets slipped back in the standings. However, they used the magic of '69 to lead the National League in attendance at Shea Stadium (just under 2.7 million)...

Tommie Agee led the Mets with 24 home runs, 182 base hits, and 107 runs scored. Donn Clendenon (22 homers) was the RBI leader with ninety-seven. Leftfielder Cleon Jones was right behind the leaders with ten dingers, 63 RBI, 140 hits, and 71 runs. Part time outfielder/first baseman Art Shamsky clubbed eleven taters and knocked in forty-nine. Lefthanded hitting third baseman/second baseman Wayne Garrett was a valuable contributor as well with his twelve home runs, 45 RBI, and 74 runs scored for the season. The Mets were ninth in the N.L. with a .249 batting average and 120 home runs. They were second with 118 stolen bases...Ace Tom Seaver led the pitching staff with an 18-12 record, 283 strikeouts, and 19 complete games. Jerry Koosman (12-7) and Jim McAndrew (10-14) were the only other double-digit winners. McAndrew led the pitching staff with three shutouts. Nolan Ryan was 7-11 with 125 K's and 97 bases on balls. He had five complete games which included two shutouts. Reliever "Tug" McGraw whiffed 81 batters. The pitching staff was the best in the N.L. with a 3.45 ERA and allowed the fewest runs (630). They rang up the most strikeouts (1,064)...The reigning National League Champions would end the season only six games behind the first place Pirates. The Bucs won their season series, 12-6. They were 4-8 against Cincinnati's "Big Red Machine" and 8-10 versus Montreal.
