With the fortunes of his ball club on the upswing, eccentric owner Charles O. Finley decided to add an apostrophe "S" to his team's logo and refer to them as the "A's" instead of "Athletics." Charlie also got into a nasty salary dispute with star Reggie Jackson which prompted commissioner Bowie Kuhn to intervene. Reggie didn't get ALL the cash he wanted; Mr. Finley had to cough up a little bit more dough than HE wanted. Reggie, in the end, had a sub-par season when compared to his usual standards: 23 homers and 66 runs batted in. Don Mincher led the ball club with 27 home runs. He also contributed 74 RBI. Bert Campaneris socked 22 dingers, drove in sixty-four, and led the team with 168 hits and 97 runs. Sal Bando hit 20 taters and was the leader with 75 RBI. Joe Rudi hit eleven round-trippers. The A's would hit .249 and 171 home runs for the year...Phenom Vida Blue no-hit the Twins, September 21st. Harmon Killebrew was the only one to reach base on a fourth-inning walk. Blue, only twenty-years of age, struck out nine batters. "Catfish" Hunter led the pitching staff with 18 wins and 178 strikeouts. Chuck Dobson won 16 games, struck out 149 batters, and led the A's with 13 complete games including five shutouts. Spot-starter Diego Segui was a ten-game winner and struck out ninety-five. The staff ERA was 3.30...Oakland ended the year nine games behind AL West champ Minnesota. The Twins won the season series, 13-5.
