Owner Walter O'Malley turned over the operation of the Dodgers organization to his son, Peter, in 1970...The ball club turned in another very good season; however, Cincy's "Big Red Machine" was beginning to flex its muscles and ran away with the NL West Division by 14 ½ games. The Dodgers won only five of eighteen games versus the Redlegs...Billy Grabarkewitz (84 RBI) led the team with 17 homers; Wes Parker had a stellar season with 10 home runs and a team leading 111 RBI. Parker finished fifth in the N.L. batting race, hit the most doubles in the N.L. (47) and won a Gold Glove for fielding excellence...Claude Osteen (114 K's) was the top winner on the pitching staff with sixteen victories while Don Sutton was high man with 201 strikeouts...Bill Singer's season was abbreviated by early injuries and later mononucleosis, but he was well enough to no-hit the Phillies at Dodger Stadium, July 20th, 5-0. He whiffed 93 batters before his season ended due to a broken finger. Closer Jim Brewer posted 91 punch outs for the season...Dodger batters led the National League with a .270 batting average and in stolen bases (138). They were twelfth with 87 home runs...The staff ERA ended the year at 3.82 and was first in the N.L. with 13 shutouts.
