The expansion Seattle Pilots suddenly moved to Milwaukee in the Spring of 1970 to play in dormant County Stadium. Future MLB Commissioner and Milwaukee native Bud Selig had made futile attempts in the past to relocate a team to his hometown after the Braves left for Atlanta in 1966. Selig, a former part-owner of the Braves and local car dealership mogul, bought the team from the bankrupt Seattle ownership...Tommy Harper led the ball club with 31 homers and 82 RBI. As a team, the Brewers hit .242, 126 homers, and stole 91 bases...Marty Pattin led the pitching staff with 14 wins, 161 K's, and eleven complete games. Lew Krausse won thirteen and struck out 130 batters. The staff ERA was 4.21...During Spring Training, NO ONE was sure where the team would wind up...The Brewers tied the Royals in the standings 33 games behind first place Minnesota...Attendance was almost 934,000.
