The "Spaceman," pitcher Bill Lee, was released by the Expos, May 9th, after failing to show up for a game in protest to the release of teammate Rodney Scott... Utilityman Joel Youngblood became the first player in major league history, August 4th, when he played for two different teams and got a hit for both teams on the same day in two different cities. Before being traded, Youngblood had driven in the winning run for the Mets against the Cubs in Chicago that afternoon and then singled that same evening for the Expos in a contest versus the Phillies in Philadelphia. The pitchers against whom Youngblood hit safely are both in the Hall of Fame: Fergie Jenkins (Cubs) and Steve Carlton (Phillies)...In the early to mid-80s, the Expos fielded some fine ball clubs. Catcher Gary Carter (97 RBI) led the team with 29 home runs and won a Gold Glove as one the finest defensive backstops in the game. First baseman Al Oliver was the team leader with 109 RBI and 204 hits. He also slugged 22 dingers. Tim Wallach hit 28 home runs and drove home ninety-seven while Andre Dawson popped 23 homers, drove in eighty-three, and led the team with 107 runs scored. "The Hawk" also won his fourth Gold Glove. Warren Cromartie added fourteen round-trippers. Montreal was fourth in the N.L. with a .262 batting average and 133 home runs...Ace Steve Rogers led the pitching staff with a 19-8 W/L record, 179 strikeouts, fourteen complete games, and four shutouts. Bill Gullickson, Scott Sanderson, and Charlie Lea ALL won twelve games. Sanderson was second on the staff with 158 K's. Closer Jeff "The Terminator" Reardon whiffed 86 batters. Lefty reliever "Woodie" Fryman won nine games out of the 'pen. The staff ERA was second in the league (3.31)...The Expos finished the year only six games out of the division lead. They WON the season series from the first place Cardinals, 10-8.
