The Redlegs' encore to the pennant-winning '61 season turned out to be a solid three-and-a-half game finish behind the National League champion Giants...Frank Robinson led the Reds with 39 home runs and 136 runs batted in. He was the major league leader after scoring 134 runs and hitting 51 doubles. Centerfielder Vada Pinson followed with 23 dingers, 100 RBI, and 107 runs scored. Gordy Coleman contributed 28 homers and 86 RBI...The ball club finished third in the N.L. with a .270 batting average, home runs (167), runs scored (802), hits (1,523), and FIRST in doubles (252)...The pitching staff boasted TWO 20-game winners: Bob Purkey (23-5) and Joey Jay (21-14). Lefty Jim O'Toole won sixteen games and led the staff with 170 strikeouts. Jay was next with 155 K's and led the staff in shutouts (4). Purkey struck out 141 batters and topped the hurlers in complete games (18). Reds' pitchers closed the season third in the league in ERA (3.75) and fourth in complete games (51)...Third baseman Gene Freese, who had hit 26 homers and driven in 87 runs in '61, was lost for nearly the entire year after suffering a broken ankle during Spring Training. The mix of replacements wouldn't come close to repeating those numbers...The ball club battled the Giants and Dodgers virtually the whole season for the league's top spot. The Reds finished just 2 ½ games in back of L. A... In their season meetings, the Reds were 9-9 versus the Dodgers and 7-11 against the Giants...Robinson led the team with 208 hits and was only .004 of a point behind L. A.'s Tommy Davis for the league batting title. Vada Pinson had 181 hits for the year.
