Marking the first time in over half-a-century, the Wrigley family was not the owner of the Cubs. The Tribune Company, owner of a Chicago newspaper and other media outlets, now ran the show...Former Phillies executive/manager Dallas Green was hired as the Cubs' General Manager on October 15, 1981. For the next few seasons, there would be a plethora of former Phils to wear Cub pinstripes: Names like Bowa, Moreland, Noles, and Johnstone are familiar names to Phillies' fans. Even Cubs' skipper Lee Elia. In January of '82, Green traded Ivan de Jesus to the Phillies in a steal of a deal bringing future Hall of Famer Ryne Sandberg and Larry Bowa to Chicago. Bowa's career was winding down, but Sandberg would become the darling of the Cub Faithful...Team leaders: Leon Durham (22 homers, 90 RBI); Bill Buckner (15 home runs, 105 RBI, 201 base hits, 34 doubles); and Keith Moreland (15 homers, 68 RBI). Sandberg was sixth in Rookie of the Year voting. He racked up 172 base hits and led the team with 103 runs scored...Fergie Jenkins returned to Wrigley Field and led the pitching staff with 14 wins and 134 strikeouts. Randy Martz won eleven...The Cubs clubbed 102 homers and hit .260 for the season...The staff's ERA was 3.92...The Cubs wore their iconic pin-striped home uniforms, but wore a blue jersey with red numbers and lettering paired with white trousers on the road. They finished 19 games behind NL East champ, St. Louis, and were 6-12 versus the Cards.
