Pete Guerrero led the Dodgers with 32 homers and 100 runs batted in. Ron Cey (24 home runs, 79 RBI) and "Dusty" Baker (23 dingers, 88 RBI) kept rallies moving. Steve Garvey had a sixteen home run season with 86 runs batted in. Steve Sax produced the most hits on the ball club (180) and runs scored (88). Lasorda's crew finished second in the N.L. with a .264 batting average and 138 home runs...Fernando Valenzuela was 19-13 and punched out 199 batters to lead the pitching staff. The 21-year old lefty and darling of the fans, led the staff with 18 complete games. He tied fellow starter Jerry Reuss with four shutouts. As for Mr. Reuss, he was 18-11 with 138 K's. Bob Welch struck out 176 batters and won sixteen games. The Dodger hurlers were the league leaders in ERA (3.26), shutouts (13) and fewest home runs allowed (81)...L. A. finished runners-up in the NL West after winning the World Series in '81. They were knocked out of playoff contention by the Giants on the season's final day, a 5-3 loss at San Francisco. The Dodgers ended the campaign just ONE game behind division champion Atlanta. In their season series, it was 11-7 in favor of the Dodgers over the Braves; they split with the Giants, 9-9...Steve Sax was named the N.L. Rookie of the Year. Steve Garvey and Ron Cey--two L. A. stalwarts for years--would both wear a different uniform in 1983: Garvey (Padres), Cey (Cubs).
