The Yankees finished 16 games behind the AL East Division champion Brewers. This was also the Yanks' first losing season since 1973...In April, Reggie Jackson returned to New York for the first time as a member of the Angels and received chants of "Reg-GIE! Reg-GIE!" from the Yankees' faithful. George Steinbrenner later admitted it was his biggest mistake to let Jackson leave New York...Managerial records: Lemon (6-8), Michael (44-42), King (29-33)...Dave Winfield was the team leader with 37 homers and 106 RBI. Switch-hitter Roy Smalley popped 20 dingers and drove home sixty-seven. He would hit a home run from BOTH sides of the plate in a game at Kansas City, September 5th. Graig Nettles and DH Oscar Gamble both hit 18 round-trippers. Willie Randolph led the team in hits (155) and runs scored (85). The Yanks were eleventh in the A.L. with a .256 team batting average and fifth in home runs (161)...Ron Guidry led the pitching staff with 14 wins while fellow lefthander Dave Righetti was the staff leader with 163 strikeouts. The former posted 162 K's; the latter won eleven ball games. Tommy John was 10-10 for the season and led the staff with nine complete games. Shane Rawley started seventeen contests, won eleven, and completed three of them. Closer "Goose" Gossage had 102 strikeout victims. The Yankee staff finished seventh in the league with a 3.99 ERA.
