*The Braves finished seven games behind the eventual World Champion Pirates. Milwaukee won nine of the 22 games with the Buccos during the regular season...The Braves were one of the best teams in baseball in the late 1950s (including a World Championship in 1957) under manager Fred Haney. After Milwaukee was eliminated, two games to none, in a playoff for the 1959 N.L. pennant, Haney decided to vacate his seat in the dugout. Owner Lou Perini brought former Brooklyn Dodgers manager Chuck Dressen into the fold to manage Perini's "Steam Shovels." The Braves' team leaders: Hank Aaron (20 doubles, 11 triples, 40 homers, 126 RBI); Eddie Mathews (39 home runs, 124 RBI); Joe Adcock (25 homers, 91 RBI); and Bill Bruton (27 doubles, 13 triples, 12 home runs, 54 RBI, 112 runs scored). Catcher Del Crandall knocked out 19 homers and drove in seventy-seven...Warren Spahn topped the pitching staff with 21 wins and 154 strikeouts. Lew Burdette (19) and Bob Buhl (16) were the Braves' other double-digit winners on the mound. Spahn and Burdette each completed 18 games; Milwaukee led the league with fifty-five...Braves boppers led the N.L. with 170 home runs and a .417 team slugging percentage. The staff ERA was 3.76. As a ball club, the Braves hit .265 for the season--second in the league. Aaron topped the N.L. in runs batted in.*
