The third year for the Halos as a major league ball club ended with a .250 team batting average--good for FIFTH in the American League--and 95 home runs which ranked them ninth overall. Leon "Daddy Wags" Wagner topped Angels batters with 26 home runs and 90 RBI for the year. Lee Thomas and highly-heralded shortstop Jim Fregosi followed with nine homers. Albie Pearson was the leader in base hits (176) and runs scored (92). Billy Moran was second after posting 65 RBI while third-sacker Felix Torres finished with a team high 32 doubles. Fregosi (12 triples) and Moran both collected 29 two-baggers...The pitching staff completed the season with a 3.53 ERA, the FIFTH best in the AL. Ken McBride and Dean Chance led the hurlers with thirteen wins. McBride completed eleven ball games. Chance was the staff leader with 168 K's... L. A. did not win a season series but played three ball clubs to a draw. After Opening Day, the closest the Angels came to first place was three games back on May 1st with a 12-10 record. At the All Star break, they had dropped to seventh and twelve games behind the league leader with a 41-46 mark. (Dodger Stadium was "home" for the Angels 1962 through 1965.)
