The M's finished just three games in back of AL West champion Oakland from whom Seattle won the season series, 12-7. The ball club spent 119 days in first place, tied or alone, the last as late as August 26th. Their largest lead came June 13th, an eight game advantage. From August 27th to season's end, the Mariners were 16-14 while Oakland compiled a 19-11 record. The M's were behind by six games on September 24th before sweeping the A's the last three games of the season in Seattle...Bret Boone led the M's with 35 home runs and 117 RBI. He tied Ichiro Suzuki for the team high in runs scored (111). Ichiro stroked 212 base hits to Boone's 183 to lead the ball club. DH Edgar Martinez (98 RBI) popped 24 homers. Mariners batters hit .271 (fifth in the A.L.) and 139 home runs (13th). They were fourth in stolen bases (108)...Seattle's pitching staff used only FIVE starters the entire season: Jamie Moyer was the ace with a 21-7 won/loss record. He posted 129 K's. Joel Pineiro went 16-11 and led the staff with 151 strikeouts, three complete games, and two shutouts. Gil Meche won fifteen contests while Freddy Garcia (144 K's) was a victor twelve times and Ryan Franklin eleven. Reliever Rafael Soriano racked up 68 punch outs. The hurlers finished second in the A.L. with a sharp 3.76 ERA for the season. They allowed the fewest runs to score in the league (637).
