On October 1st, Ichiro Suzuki stroked two singles in the early stages of a game against the Rangers at Safeco Field for 258 base hits in a season. He surpassed Hall of Famer George Sisler's long standing major league record set in 1920 with the St. Louis Browns. Ichiro went on to get four more hits to end the season with 262 overall. He led the ball club with 101 runs scored and the majors in batting average. Second baseman Bret Boone topped the M's with 24 homers and 83 RBI. Finishing second was Raul Ibanez with 16 home runs while Randy Winn followed with 14 dingers and was second in hits (179) as well as RBI (81). Seattle would hit .270 and 136 home runs for the season...Spot starter Ron Villone was the pitching staff's top winner with just eight victories. He had 86 strikeouts. Jamie Moyer led the staff with 125 punch outs and tied Gil Meche with seven wins. Joel Pineiro and Bobby Madritsch both won six ball games. The staff ended the season with a 4.76 ERA...The M's were last in the AL West 29 games out of first and 26 games behind the third place Texas Rangers.
