The Rangers won the AL West by nine games over Seattle, but lost to the Blue Jays, 3-0, in the ALDS for the second straight year. On May 15th in Texas, Toronto and the Rangers met on the field in two bench-clearing brawls: After Matt Bush hit the Jays' Jose Bautista in the ribs with a pitch, Bautista slid exceptionally hard into second baseman Rougned Odor which resulted in Odor punching Bautista in the face and leading to the first skirmish. Later in the game, Jays' pitcher Jesse Chavez hit the Rangers' Prince Fielder with a pitch causing the benches to empty a second time. (Texas and Toronto had had a very contentious ALDS in 2015.)...Team leaders: Rougned Odor (33 home runs, 88 RBI); Adrian Beltre (32 homers, 104 RBI); and ace Cole Hamels (15 wins, 200 strikeouts). Newcomer Ian Desmond had team highs in base hits (178) and runs scored (107). Prince Fielder underwent his second neck operation in three years and later decided to end his career in early August due to his physical issues. At that point, Fielder had slammed 319 homers, combined, while playing with Milwaukee, Detroit, and Texas...The Rangers hit .262 (good for third in the A.L.) and 215 home runs for the season...The staff's ERA was 4.37 (13th). They led the American League in saves (56).
