Team leaders: Mark Trumbo led the major leagues with 47 home runs; he topped the Orioles (108) in runs batted in. Chris Davis slammed 38 homers while driving in 84 runs. Manny Machado had a marvelous season with 37 home runs and 96 RBI. He led the O's in base hits (188), runs scored (105), and finished fifth in Most Valuable Player voting...Chris Tillman's sixteen victories led the pitching staff; Kevin Gausman topped the hurlers with 174 strikeouts. Closer Zach Britton was PERFECT with 47 saves in 47 save opportunities and posted the lowest ERA (at this point) in major league history for pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched in a season. Britton set an all-time record with no earned runs allowed in 43 consecutive appearances...The O's were eliminated from the post-season in the A.L. Wild Card Game, 5-2, by Toronto, in eleven innings at the Rogers Centre. Baltimore and Toronto posted identical records during the regular season, but the Blue Jays won the home field advantage for the Wild Card Game by winning the season series between the two, ten games to nine. The Orioles opened the season with seven straight victories...Baltimore is the only team (thus far) to hit 55 or more home runs in two separate months...Orioles batters were first in the majors with 253 home runs and ninth in the American League with a .256 batting average...The staff ERA ended the year at 4.22; their 54 saves were second in the American League.
