Lou Brock broke the modern National League record (Maury Wills, 104) for stolen bases in a season on September 10th against the Phillies in St. Louis. Outfielder "Bake" McBride was named the NL's Rookie of the Year (.309 batting average, six homers, 56 RBI).

Team leaders: Reggie Smith (23 homers, 100 RBI); Ted Simmons (20 home runs, 103 RBI); Joe Torre (11 homers, 70 RBI); Lynn McGlothen (16 wins, 142 strikeouts). Brock posted a team high 194 base hits and 105 runs scored. Bob Gibson was 11-13 with 129 K's and nine complete games...The Redbirds hit 83 home runs (fewest in the league) and .265 as a team with 172 stolen bases--the latter the most in the senior circuit. The pitching staff's ERA was 3.48, sixth in the N.L...The Cards finished just 1 ½ games in back of division champion, Pittsburgh, from whom St. Louis WON the season series, 11-7...A little over 1.83 million fans enjoyed Cardinals baseball at Busch Stadium...Twenty-year-old Keith Hernandez made his major league debut, August 30th, going one for two with a run batted in versus the Giants near his home in San Francisco...Closer Al Hrabosky whiffed 82 batters for the season.
