Team leaders: Bobby Bonds (21 home runs, 71 RBI, 97 runs scored); Gary Matthews (16 homers, 82 RBI, 161 base hits); and Dave Kingman (18 home runs, 55 RBI). The Giants hit .252 as a team with just 93 homers...Mike Caldwell was the staff's top winner with fourteen victories (83 K's). John D'Acquisto won twelve and led the staff with 167 strikeouts. Jim Barr was a 13-game winner and the staff leader with 11 complete games and five shutouts. The staff's ERA was 3.78...Juan Marichal made his major league debut with the Giants, July 19, 1960, striking out twelve Phillies and allowing only one hit and one walk in nine innings. He won his first major league game that day. The future Hall of Famer's contract was purchased by the Red Sox, December 7, 1973. He pitched his last game wearing a Dodgers' uniform in April 1975...Managers' records: Charlie Fox (34-42) and Wes Westrum (38-48)...At cold and damp Candlestick Park, the Giants drew just under 520,000 fans--dead last in the National League--to see a bad team...They finished 30 games in back of first place, L. A., and lost the season series to the Dodgers, 12-6.
