The Phillies ended the season with a record under .500 and would not do so again until 1985...Talk about a team on the upswing: At the Astrodome, June 10th, Mike Schmidt hit a ball so hard it hit a speaker on the roof of the ball park and ricocheted straight down to the playing field. Most observers say it would have easily been a home run in any other stadium, but the ground rules in Houston read the ball was still "in play". Schmitt, who had started a slow home run trot, was held to a single. Two other base runners moved up only one base. It was later estimated the blast probably would have traveled close to five hundred feet if not interrupted on its flight...In leading the ball club, Schmidt launched 36 home runs and drove in 116 for his first huge season in Phillies pin-stripes. His homer output led the league and 108 runs scored topped the Phils. Willie Montanez was next with 79 RBI and Del Unser with seven dingers. Slugger Greg Luzinski hit seven home runs in an injury plagued campaign including knee surgery. Dave Cash posted a team high 206 base hits. The Phillies hit .261 and 95 homers; they led the N.L. with 50 triples...Jim Lonborg topped the pitching staff with 17 victories. Steve Carlton was 16-13 and led the staff with 240 strikeouts and 17 complete games. The hurlers completed the year with a 3.91 ERA and were second in the league with 46 complete games...Philadelphia finished just eight games behind division champion Pittsburgh, but won the season series, 10-8. For the next five seasons, the rivalry between the cross-state ball clubs would be one of the most hotly contested and closely watched in baseball.
