New skipper Grady Little guided his charges to the N. L. Wild Card, but were eliminated from post-season play after losing the NLDS to the Mets, 3-0. Rookies Russell Martin, Andre Ethier, James Loney, and pitcher Chad Billingsley were instrumental in keeping the Dodgers' ship afloat despite a 12-17 start and losing the first 13 of 14 games after the All Star break. Veterans such as Nomar Garciaparra and Jeff Kent battled hard-to-shake aches and pains throughout the season. San Diego and L. A. finished in a flat tie for first in the NL West, but the Padres won the division with a 13-5 record versus the Dodgers during the regular schedule...Team leaders: J. D. Drew and Garciaparra (both 20 home runs); Drew (100 RBI); Rafael Furcal (196 base hits, 113 runs scored); Derek Lowe and Brad Penny (both 16 wins); and Penny (148 strikeouts)...The Dodgers put up the league's best batting average (.276), the most hits (1,552), and most triples (58). They ended the year fifteenth in home runs (153). The pitching staff's ERA (4.23) was fourth.
