The Tribe sank below the .500 mark on June 6th and remained there the rest of the season. Their greatest deficits were 17 games under .500 and 28 games out of first place, both on August 8th. After Game 81, they had posted a 38-43 record...The Indians ended the year fourth in team batting average (.280) and fifth with 196 home runs in the A. L. Designated hitter Travis Hafner clobbered 42 homers and drove in 117 runs to lead the ball club. Grady Sizemore figured in league MVP voting (11th) with a team-leading 190 base hits, 134 runs scored, 53 doubles, and 11 triples. He finished second to Hafner with 28 home runs. Sizemore also led the majors in runs scored and extra-base hits (92). He tied the Pirates Freddy Sanchez for the big league lead in doubles...Jake Westbrook topped the pitching staff with 15 victories. Right behind was Cliff Lee (14 wins) and C. C. Sabathia (12 wins). Sabathia was the leader in strikeouts (172) and complete games (six). The staff ended the year with a 4.41 ERA (sixth best in the league) and 13 complete games which led the A. L...Kevin Kouzmanoff became the second player in major league history to hit a grand slam home run on the FIRST PITCH he saw in his first big league at bat, September 2nd. (The other is Daniel Nava.) Likewise, he was the 23rd major leaguer to homer in his first AB and the third to hit a grand slam.
