Ryan Howard (aka "Big Piece") was the National League's Most Valuable Player. His monster season included a major league leading 58 home runs and 149 RBI. The Phils were bolstered by other huge seasons from Chase Utley (32 homers, 102 RBI); Jimmy Rollins (25 home runs, 83 RBI); and Pat Burrell (29 homers, 95 RBI). Utley would lead the ball club with 203 hits and 131 runs scored. Rollins was on Utley's heels with 191 hits while crossing the plate 127 times. Howard rang up 182 base hits and scored 104 times. Part timer David Dellucci smacked thirteen dingers. The Phillies scored the most runs in the N.L. (865), were sixth in batting average (.267) and third in home runs (216)...Brett Myers was the leader of the pitching staff with a 12-7 record and 189 strikeouts. Jon Lieber and Cole Hamels (the latter posted 145 K's) each won nine games. Spot starter Ryan Madson was 11-9 with 99 punch outs. Starter Cory Lidle added eight victories. Closer Tom Gordon kept busy with 68 strikeout victims. The staff ERA was tenth in the league at 4.60...The Phils finished second behind NL East champ New York by 12 games. The Mets won their season series, 11-8.
