The Rangers were in a tie or held first place alone for 51 days of the schedule up through July 15<sup>th</sup> with a 47-44 record. (They had a lead of as many as five games on May 30<sup>th</sup>.) Then the bottom fell out of the season. From July 16<sup>th</sup> through August 8<sup>th</sup>, they won nine of twenty-three games taking them out of contention and placing them 6 ½ games behind the AL West leader. They never recovered...Mark Teixeira led the ball club with 33 homers and 110 RBI. Michael Young (14 home runs) was the leader with 217 base hits and 52 doubles. He knocked in one hundred three. Gary Matthews, Jr. was second with 19 homers and led the team in runs scored (102). For the year, the Rangers hit .278 and 183 home runs...The seven primary starting pitchers posted an awful average ERA of 5.12. The staff's ERA for the season was 4.60, eighth in the A. L. Kevin Millwood won sixteen games and struck out 157 batters to lead the hurlers. Vicente Padilla followed with fifteen victories and 156 K's...Manager "Buck" Showalter was let go at the end of the year after compiling a 319-329 (.492) record from the dugout over four seasons. The Rangers finished as high as third in three of those years.
