The defending World Champions spent nearly all of the 2006 season challenging for the top spot once again in the A. L. Central. The Pale Hose even held sole possession of first place from April 19th through May 15th. By August 7th, the White Sox were in second place ten games out (their largest deficit of the year) but ran out of time to catch and topple first place Minnesota. They ended the campaign six games and in third place behind the Twins. A winning ball club attracted over 2.95 million fans to U. S. Cellular Field, third in the league...The White Sox were fourth in the A. L. with a .280 team batting average and first in the majors with 236 home runs. Jermaine Dye, fifth in league MVP balloting, was the leader with 44 home runs and 120 RBI. Designated hitter Jim Thome launched 42 round-trippers, drove in 109 runs, and scored the most runs (108). Paul Konerko blasted 35 dingers, topped team with 177 base hits, and finished second to Dye in RBI (113). Add Joe Crede to the list of big-boppers with his 30 homers and 94 RBI...Pitching was the White Sox Achilles heal. The staff ended the season tenth in the A. L. with a 4.61 ERA. The starting staff won 71 of the team's 90 victories: Jon Garland (18), Freddy Garcia (17), Jose Contreras (13), Mark Buehrle (12), and Javier Vazquez (11). Those big five had an average ERA of 4.63. Vazquez topped the staff with 184 strikeouts. Closer Bobby Jenks was third in the majors in saves; he whiffed 80 batters for the year...Chicago posted a combined record of 21-17 versus the Twins and Tigers, the two ball clubs who finished the season ahead of the White Sox.
