The Blue Jays spent the better part of the season in third place of the AL East which is where they landed by the All Star break at 49-39 and just five games behind the division leader. They won four of the last five games of the year, played against the Tigers and Yankees, to sneak into second one game ahead of the Red Sox. Toronto won twelve of nineteen games from Boston during the regular season. Versus the first place Yankees, the Jays won eight of nineteen...Troy Glaus popped 38 home runs and scored 105 times to lead the ball club. Vernon Wells took home a Gold Glove for defensive excellence and socked 32 homers. His 185 base hits and 106 RBI were tops on the team. Lyle Overbay hit 22 home runs, 46 doubles and drove in 92. For the year, Toronto hit .284 and 199 homers as a team...Reportedly, skipper John Gibbons and pitcher Ted Lilly got into a physical altercation following Lilly's removal from a game, August 26th at Rogers Centre. The pair later explained whatever differences that existed had been ironed out after the scuffle in a tunnel leading back to the Jays' clubhouse. Lilly was a 15-game winner and led the pitching staff with 160 strikeouts. Roy Halladay finished third in American League Cy Young Award voting with a 16-5 won/loss record, four complete games, and 132 punch outs. A. J. Burnett won ten ball games. Closer B. J. Ryan whiffed 86 batters. The staff's ERA of 4.37 ranked them fifth in the A. L.
