The Cardinals celebrated their tenth World Series title in the franchise's 115th season in the National League. St. Louis won 31 of the first 47 games making them appear to be well on their way to the team's sixth playoff appearance in seven years. During the middle part of the year, pitcher Mark Mulder was lost for the season while Jim Edmonds and David Eckstein missed significant playing time. Several key players under-performed as well. The Cards fought their way into the post-season on the last day of the regular schedule and began a very unlikely run: The Padres went down in four games of the NLDS; the Mets were sent packing after a 4-3 NLCS victory by the Redbirds; and the Tigers were tamed and finally caged in a five-game World Series... Albert Pujols romped in a brand new Busch Stadium which opened April 10th. His batting average placed him third in the N. L.; he finished second in home runs (49) and RBI (137); and led the majors with an off-the-chart 1.102 OPS. Pujols also collected a team-high 177 base hits and 119 runs scored. The ball club hit .269 for the season and 184 homers...Chris Carpenter's 15-8 won/loss record led the pitching staff as well as his 184 strikeouts. Jason Marquis won fourteen ball games and Jeff Suppan twelve. The staff ERA closed at 4.54, ninth in the league...Pujols was SECOND in balloting for the N. L. MVP Award to the Phillies Ryan Howard...The Cards .516 regular season winning percentage is the lowest in MLB history for a World Series Champion.
