The Marlins over-achieved as a ball club in '06 and challenged for the National League Wild Card spot despite having a roster composed mostly of low-priced veterans and youngsters...Miguel Cabrera and Josh Willingham both hit 26 home runs to lead "The Fish." Cabrera also led the Marlins with 114 RBI, 195 base hits, and 50 doubles. N. L. Rookie of the Year, Hanley Ramirez, produced a remarkable season with 17 home runs, 11 triples, 46 doubles, 185 base hits, and a team-high 119 runs scored. He finished fifth in the majors in stolen bases. The Marlins posted a .264 team batting average and 182 homers...Dontrelle Willis, Scott Olsen, and Josh Johnson all won twelve games to lead the pitching staff. Olsen's 166 K's were the most of group. Willis added 160 strikeouts and completed four games. Ricky Nolasco and Anibal Sanchez pumped up the pitching corps with eleven and ten wins, respectively. The Marlins 4.37 ERA placed them fifth in the league...Manager Joe Girardi, greatly responsible for getting the most out his team with so little, was fired, surprisingly, after the season with only ONE year directing from the dugout. He would reappear as the Yankees skipper in 2008 and produce a World Championship in the Bronx in 2009.
