The Reds finished just 3 ½ games behind the eventual World Champion Cardinals in the NL Central and won their season series from the Redbirds, 9-6..Big Adam Dunn led the ball club with 40 homers, 92 RBI, and 99 runs scored. Ken Griffey, Jr. (27 home runs, 72 RBI); Rich Aurilia (23 homers, 70 RBI); and David Ross (21 homers, 52 RBI) were huge contributors. Brandon Phillips led the team with 148 base hits. He drove in 75 runs. For the year, the Reds hit .257 as a team and 217 home runs, the latter second in the N. L..Toeing the slab, Aaron Harang was the high-man with 16 wins, 216 strikeouts, and six complete games. Bronson Arroyo won fourteen and whiffed one hundred eighty-four of the opposition. The pitching staff's ERA at season's end was 4.51, ranking them seventh in the final standings..Versus division competition, the Reds posted a positive 46-38 record.
