*This capsule of the Braves' '75 season HAS to begin on November 4, 1974. Hank Aaron, a member of the ball club since 1954, was traded back to Milwaukee where it all began for outfielder Dave May. During his 21 years in a Braves' uniform, Aaron was a .310 hitter who launched 733 home runs...Darrell Evans led the Braves with 22 home runs, 73 RBI, and 82 runs scored. "Dusty" Baker was second with 19 dingers and 72 RBI. May would hit 12 homers while Vic Correll and Earl Williams both popped eleven. For the year, the Braves hit .244 and 107 home runs...Carl Morton led the pitching staff with 17 wins. Phil Niekro (15-15) was tops on the staff with 144 strikeouts and 13 complete games. Lefty reliever Tom House was next with seven victories. The staff pitched to a 3.91 ERA...Under Clyde King's direction, the team had started to show a lot of promise. On August 29<sup>th</sup>, King would be let go as manager with the ball club 58-76 and 31 ½ games behind the first place Reds. A former Brave who played with the team when they still called Boston home, Connie Ryan was named interim manager and finished the season 9-18. The Braves finished 40 ½ games behind division champ Cincinnati.*
