The first season the Padres didn't finish last in the NL West since becoming a major league franchise in 1969. They even held a tie or the LEAD for thirteen days in April. Their largest cushion was 1 ½ games...Thirty-seven year old Willie McCovey led the ball club with 23 homers. Young star Dave Winfield added 15 dingers and was tops with 76 RBI as well as 74 runs scored. Tito Fuentes had the team high with 158 base hits. The end of the season found the Padres in tenth place in the N.L. with a .244 batting average. They were last in home runs (78)...Number One starter Randy Jones, with a 20-12 record, led the pitching staff in victories, complete games (18), and shutouts (six). Dan Spillner (five wins) posted the most strikeouts (104). Joe McIntosh and Brent Strom both won eight ball games. The staff's ERA of 3.48 placed them fifth in the league...At the season's mid-point, the ball club was 38-43, in fourth place, 14 games out.
