**The team that was christened... "THE LUMBER COMPANY."**

The Buccos won their fifth NL East title in six years but were swept in the NLCS, three games to none, by one of the BEST teams in history for a single season: The '75 Cincinnati Reds...The Pirates finished the season fourth in the N.L. with a .263 batting average and were the league leaders with 138 home runs.

Dave Parker, now the everyday rightfielder, hit for a "triple double" with 35 doubles, 10 triples, and a team high 25 home runs. "The Cobra" also led the Bucs with 101 runs batted in. Al Oliver led the ball club after scoring 90 runs and tied Rennie Stennett for the team lead with 176 base hits. Willie Stargell mashed 22 homers and knocked in 90 runs. Richie Zisk popped 20 dingers; Oliver was next with eighteen...Jerry Reuss was tops on the pitching staff with 18 victories, 131 strikeouts, 16 complete games, and six shutouts. Lefty Jim Rooker won thirteen games and tall, slender righthander Bruce Kison twelve. Ken Brett added nine victories to the Bucs' win total. The staff finished the year second in the N.L. with a 3.01 ERA and allowed the fewest home runs (79)...Pittsburgh outdistanced the quickly improving Phillies by 6 ½ games in the NL East but the Phils took the season series, 11-7. The season series with Cincinnati's "Big Red Machine" was a 6-6 split.
