Fred Lynn had a year only first year players can dream about: Rookie of the Year in the American League (.331 batting average; league leader in doubles (47), runs scored (103), slugging percentage (.566)...and a Gold Glove to boot). Freddie was the A.L.'s Most Valuable Player as well. To complete his stellar season, Lynn popped 21 homers, led the Red Sox in base hits (175) and RBI (105).

"Beantown" fans have always been proud of this ball club--among the finest of any Red Sox teams. They swept the Oakland A's in the ALCS, then took one of the greatest teams of all-time, the '75 Reds, to seven games in the World Series. A seventh game was necessary because New Hampshire native Carlton "Pudge" Fisk hit one of the most dramatic home runs in World Series annals down the left field line and off the foul pole at Fenway Park. It came in the twelfth inning of Game Six, a 7-6 victory on October 21st, to keep the Red Sox alive.

Jim Rice led the ball club with 22 home runs and was second to Lynn with 174 hits. Bernie Carbo slugged 15 round-trippers while Carl Yastrzemski and Cecil Cooper both popped fourteen. "Yaz" knocked in 60 runs for the season. Boston led the majors in batting (.275) and finished fourth in the A.L. with 134 home runs. They scored the most runs in the league (796), had the most hits (1,500) and led the majors in doubles (284)...Tall righthander Rick Wise led the pitching staff with 19 wins. He completed seventeen games and struck out 141 batters. Luis Tiant was 18-14 with a team high 142 K's and 18 complete games. Lefty Bill Lee contributed 17 victories and led the staff with four shutouts. Spot starter Roger Moret won fourteen ball games and Reggie Cleveland thirteen. The staff ERA was ninth in the league (3.98)...Boston took control of first place for good in the AL East July 6th with a 43-37 record...The Bosox won the season series with the Yankees, 11-5.
