Not a pretty season for the Tigers: Last place in the AL East, 37 ½ games behind the division winning Red Sox...The fifth worst record in Tigers' history to date...A .249 team batting average and 4.27 team earned run average, both the second worst for '75 in the American League. Detroit was outscored 786 runs to 570...The great Ernie Harwell had to be at his best (which was considerable) every day to broadcast a Tigers' game THIS season...The ball club actually spent EIGHT days in first place during April. They were tied for the top spot on May 1st with a 10-7 record...Then the bottom fell out. By the All Star break, the Tigers were sixth, 10 ½ games out of first place with a 39-47 record...Designated hitter Willie Horton led the Tigers with 25 home runs, 92 runs batted in, and 169 base hits. Catcher Bill Freehan (14 homers, 47 RBI) was an All Star for the last time in his career. His defense and leadership behind the plate were excellent as usual. Slick-fielding third baseman Aurelio Rodriguez had 13 dingers and 60 RBI. Leon Roberts added ten homers. Speedster Ron LeFlore scored a team high 66 runs. For the season, Detroit finished sixth in the A.L. with 125 home runs...Mickey Lolich led the pitching staff with 12 wins, 139 strikeouts, and 19 complete games. Vern Ruhle posted 11 victories while Joe Coleman was 10-18 with 125 K's. Closer John Hiller whiffed 87 batters...Their longest winning streak was nine games in July. They lost NINETEEN in a row from July 29th to August 15th.
