For the first time in major league history, the Braves had **THREE** hitters with forty or more home runs: Hank Aaron (40), Darrell Evans (41), and Davey Johnson (43). Aaron finished the season just one homer short of tying Babe Ruth's all-time career home run record. Darrell Evans was the leader with 104 RBI and 114 runs scored. Johnson and "Dusty" Baker both drove in 99 runs. Aaron knocked in ninety-six. Ralph Garr, aka the "Road Runner," posted a team high 200 base hits...The Braves led the National League in batting average (.266), home runs (206), runs scored (799), and base hits (1,497)...Carl Morton led the pitching staff with 15 victories, ten complete games, and four shutouts. Phil Niekro was a 13-game winner and led the staff with 131 K's. Roric Harrison won eleven. The hurlers ended the year with a 4.25 ERA...Atlanta would finish 22 ½ games behind the first place Reds who won the season series, 13-5. The Braves blitzed the Padres, twelve games to six.
