**In a season where it appeared no team seemed capable of taking charge in the NL East, the Cardinals finished just 1 ½ games in back of the eventual champion New York Mets...Joe Torre and Ted Simmons (192 base hits) both led the ball club with 13 home runs while Simmons topped the team with 91 RBI and 36 doubles. Torre knocked in 69 runs. Lou Brock had a team high 193 base hits and 110 runs scored. He led the majors in steals--only three in front of the Reds' Joe Morgan...Rick Wise was the leader of the pitching staff with 16 victories, 144 strikeouts, 14 complete games, and five shutouts. Reggie Cleveland (14) and Alan Foster (13) followed Wise in wins. Bob Gibson was 12-10 with 142 K's and 13 complete games. "Gibby" was awarded his eighth career Gold Glove as well...The Cards were 8-10 versus the Mets in the regular season. St. Louis batted .259 with 75 homers (the latter was last in the N.L.); they were second in the league with 240 doubles. The staff ERA was 3.25 (2nd lowest in the N.L.) with 105 homers allowed (the fewest in the league).**
