Catcher Ted Simmons was the team leader with 16 home runs, 96 runs batted in, and 36 doubles. Joe Torre slugged 11 homers and drove in eighty-one. With 63 stolen bases, Lou Brock led the National League in swiped bags for the sixth time in seven years. He led the Redbirds with 193 base hits and 81 runs scored...Bob Gibson's 19-11 W/L record topped the pitching staff as did his 208 strikeouts, 23 complete games, and four shutouts--all in a strike-shortened season. Rick Wise posted a 16-16 record; Reggie Cleveland was 14-15 with 153 K's for the year...The Cards finished 21 ½ games in back of National League East champion, Pittsburgh, who won the season series, 10-8...St. Louis hit the fewest homers in the N.L. (70), but ended the year second with a .260 team batting average. The pitching staff led the league with 64 complete games and was sixth in ERA at 3.42.
