Nate Colbert led the Padres with 38 homers, 111 runs batted in, 141 base hits, 87 runs scored, and 27 doubles. Second was Leron Lee with 12 dingers and 47 RBI. Padres' hitters batted .227 with 102 home runs. They scored 488 runs--the fewest in the National League...The top winner on the pitching staff was Clay Kirby with 12 victories. His 175 K's also led the hurlers. Steve Arlin won 10 games and led the staff with 12 complete games. On July 18th, Arlin came within one out of the team's first no-hitter against the Phillies, a 5-1 victory at San Diego Stadium. Fred Norman won nine games, whiffed 167 batters, and led the staff with six shutouts. The staff's ERA was 3.78 with 960 strikeouts--the latter third in the league. They allowed a total of 665 runs by the opposition...Don Zimmer replaced Preston Gomez as manager April 27th. Before his release, Gomez--the team's first skipper--posted a 4-7 won/loss mark; Zimmer was 54-88...The Padres WON the season series with N.L. champion, Cincinnati, 10-8; but finished 38 ½ games behind the Reds in the standings. They were a combined 13-45 versus the Astros, Dodgers, Pirates, and Giants.
